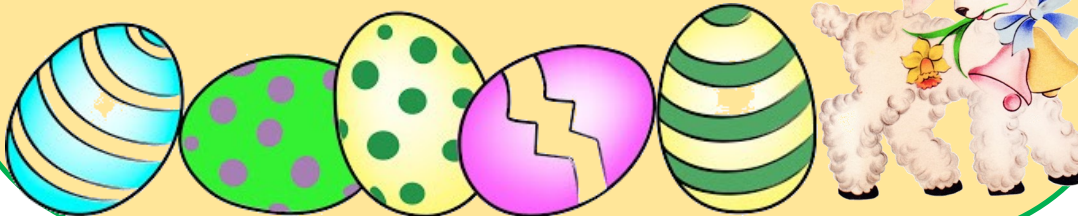

In mathematics, the children have been making dinosaurs using a range of shapes and then naming the shapes the children have used. There were some lovely designs!

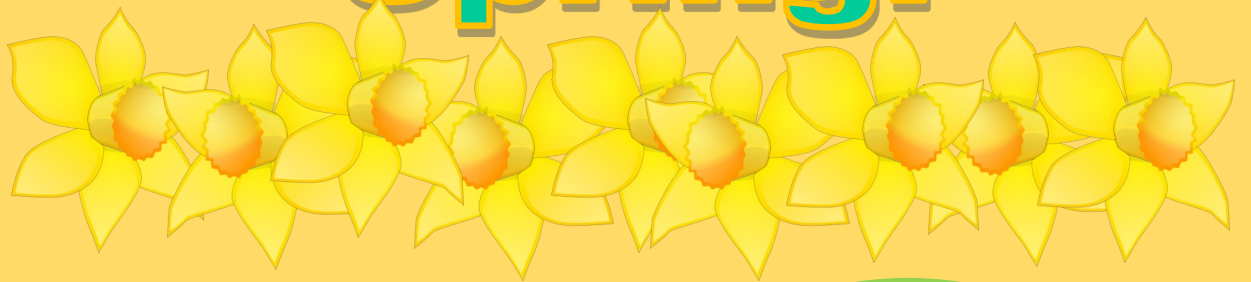

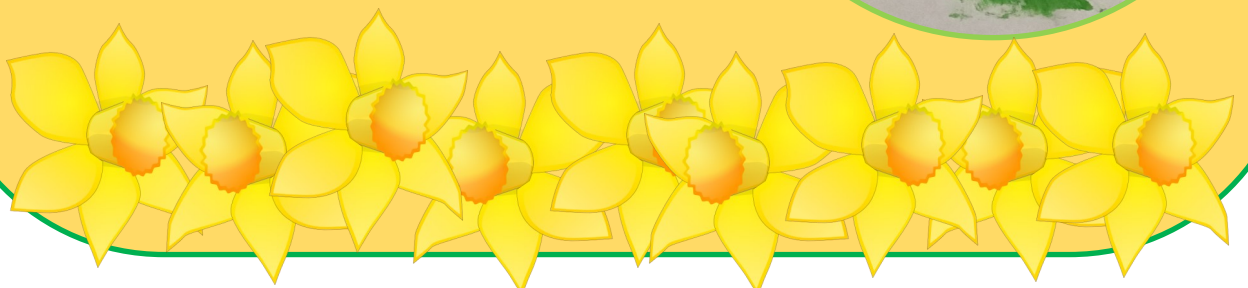

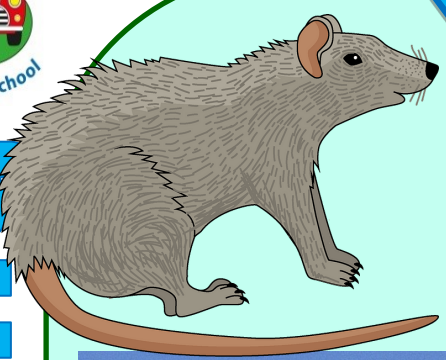


The children have also embraced the start of Spring by painting some pictures of daffodils, and they have made their own play-dough following a recipe.



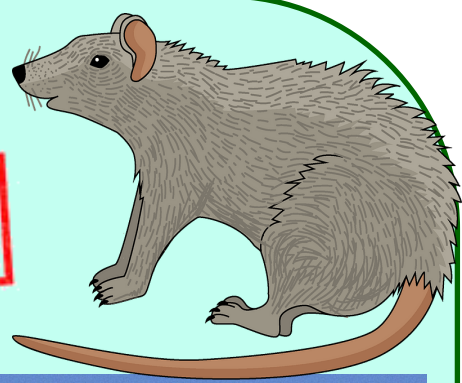

Wednesday 24th March 2021

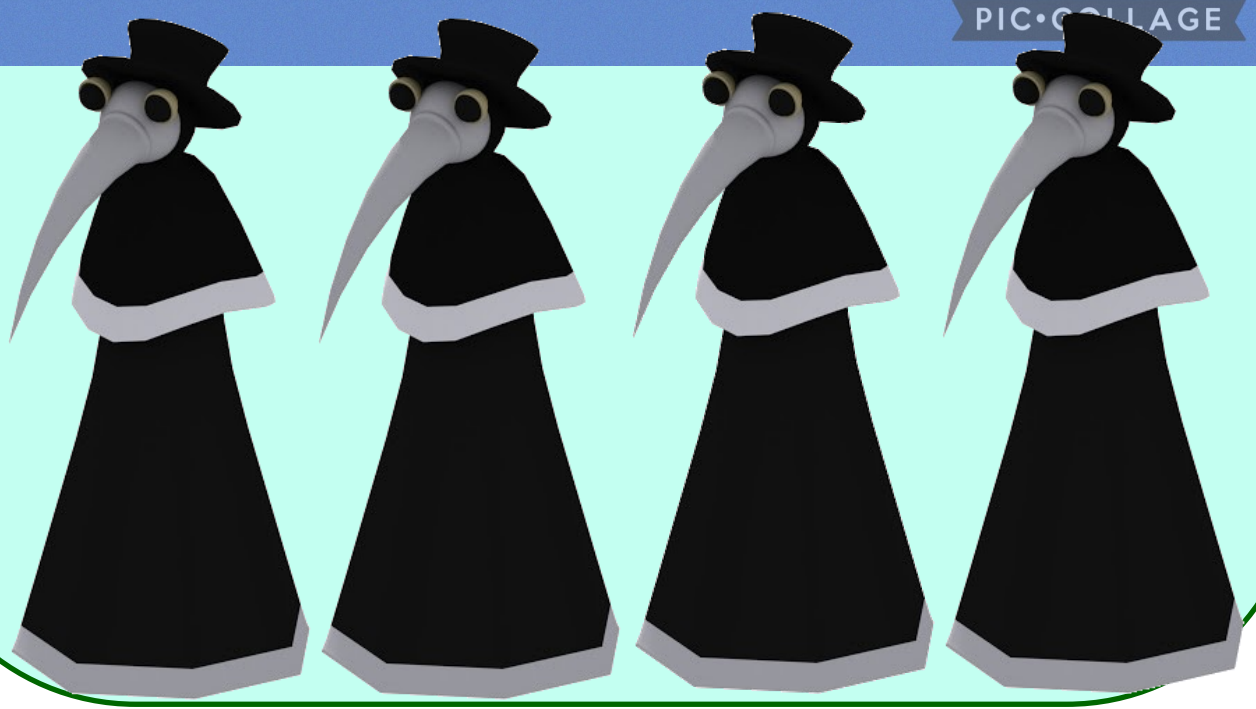
LO: To discuss reasons the plague spread.

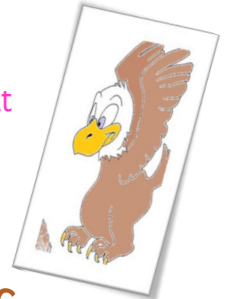
Persevere
